These issues are critical to meeting carbon reduction targets by 2050 or earlier.
Employment	 How will you support the provision of rural employment and housing? 	 There is a lack of focus on promoting small scale work and affordable housing in rural communities which increases commuting and the desertion of rural communities by younger people.
